THE AINLEY FAMILY - A LEGACY IN WOODLAKE - 1905 TO PRESENT

The Ainley legacy in Woodlake starts with Charles and Agnes (Gray) who ventured here from southern California in 1905, buying property in the Elderwood area with hopes of raising oranges. Five sons and one daughter were born to them, but there was not enough water for the orange trees, so they left the ranch and headed back to southern California.

The second generation decided to give Elderwood a try. Charles and Agnes' son Ralph married Jessie Herrington in 1920 and settled in the old homestead.

They quickly involved themselves in the community of Woodlake. Ralph Ainley was on the WUHS school board from 1936-1956. The family was very active in the Woodlake community, mainly because Ralph saw to it that they and any other children in Elderwood had transportation into town. He was known for

filling up his car, including the trunk, with everyone he could find and bringing them to Woodlake for events at school or at the Woodlake Presbyterian Church, where they were active members; the record was 22 kids in the old Packard! Ralph and Jessie had 5 children, all graduates of WUHS:

The oldest son, Richard (1940) became a veterinarian in Santa Maria, CA. His three children are Diane, Cheryl and Rick. Cheryl attended WHS during her junior year of high school (1971-72).

David (1941) homesteaded in Alaska and was one of the founders of the town North Pole.

Mary (1941) was a school teacher who lived in Morro Bay for many years and now resides in Exeter.

Hope Ainley Burris taught Kindergarten at FJW Learning Center for 20+ years. She and her husband John had 2 girls, Melodee Chapman (1977) and Carolyn Hughes (1978) and lived on the Ainley ranch during their tenure in Woodlake. John and Hope have moved to Alturas to be near Carolyn and her family.

Frank (1951) ranched for many years, then taught and coached at WHS for

36 years. He and his wife Barbara Brewer (1950), who was the first Woodlake Lions Club Rodeo Queen, live on the old homestead and have 4 children, all graduates of WHS. Tim (1973) and his wife, Darlene Jamison (1972) had four children, all of whom attended Visalia schools. Annette Buckley (1974) has three

daughters and lives in Visalia. One of her daughters, Brittnav, teaches First Grade at F. J. White Learning Center. Frank Jr. (1977) and his wife Lori De Boer (1977) have 3 children: Frank, III (1995) married Sati Berry (1995) and they live in Three Rivers with two sons; Ted (1998) also living in Three Rivers is married and has two daughters; and Corinne (2001) who recently married Kyle Manes (2004). Craig (1980) has three daughters who attended Visalia schools.

Another of Charles and Agnes' sons, Charles, came to Woodlake in 1940. He and his wife Vera (who just passed away in December 2009 at 104) settled in Elderwood after a term as missionaries in Mexico. Charles taught and coached at WUHS from 1944

to 1954. Their five children were all graduates of WHS: Bill (1945) missionary to Africa; Chuck (1946) a teacher; Robert, (1948), (played on the first WHS valley championship football team in 1947); Bette (1953), a teacher, resides in Alaska; and Ben (1956) and his wife Margie Metcalf (1956) both school teachers.

The only daughter of Charles & Agnes, Ann Hope Ainley, married Fred Van

derhoof. They purchased property at the end of Avenue 380 in Elderwood and raised world-renown purebred Polled Hereford cattle, at one time the largest breeder in the west (now the Rabb Ranch). Their son, Robert (Bob) attended WHS but graduated elsewhere, married Margaret Mills (1944) and had his veterinary practice at the ranch for many years. Their children, John (1968), Cathy (1969) and Fred (1973) attended Woodlake Schools and graduated from WHS. John and his wife Mary returned to Woodlake; their daughter, Victoria graduated from WHS in 2004.

The Vanderhoof's daughter, Elizabeth (attended WHS), married Leonard Hansen, and settled in Woodlake. Their contributions to Woodlake have been highlighted in previous newsletters. Their children are Suzanne VanLaningham Bidwell (1964), whose children Liz (1990) Rose and Luke (1992) are both WHS grads. Cynthia Brickey (1965) whose family resides in Fresno; Betsi (Helgesen (1968) whose husband, Eric came to WHS with Teacher Corps in 1969. Their daughters, Kristen (1992), Katie

(1995), are Woodlake grads, but a move to Reedley placed their two sons at Immanuel High School. David (1971) married Janice Walters (1971) and now reside in the Reedley area; where their four children attended schools.




